## **MAYOR'S REPORT:**

- a) The Mayor reported on his attendance at the West Kootenay Boundary 2010 Committee Meeting in Trail. He stated that the 2010 Committee's mandate is much broader than just sports, as it is intended to include other things such the arts, culture, literacy, etc. He stated that it was intended to have a discussion at the meeting regarding funding that may be available from the legacy fund, but due to inclement weather the individual, from Vancouver, could not attend the meeting. He further advised that on November 24<sup>th</sup> a meeting will be held in Vancouver for the regional representatives. It was suggested by Members of Council that Renee Bernier be requested to come and update Council on this matter, upon her return from her meeting in Vancouver on November 24<sup>th</sup>.
- b) The Mayor provided a summary of the meeting of the Regional District Airport Reliability Committee, referring to the minutes of that meeting.
- c) The Mayor circulated copies of the vandalism report for the month of October, 2004, stating that vandalism for this month was \$2,304.45. He further pointed out that the City has spent some \$9,874.32, repairing vandalism, since this July of this year.
