DELEGATIONS:

Staff Sgt. Al Olsen – Grand Forks RCMP Update

Staff Sgt. Olsen was welcomed to the meeting and began his presentation by providing background on himself. He stated that he has been with the RCMP for 33, mostly in small areas, such as Grand Forks. He advised that he is planning on retiring here.

He reported on a new computer system called CRIME, which has been implemented in the Nelson detachment area to obtain stats and reports. He presented crime statistics report, for the Grand Forks area, a copy of which is attached to this minutes. He stated that most crimes in the Grand Forks area are very low in numbers. He stated that the biggest crime in the area is vandalism and property damage. He stated that he would like Grand Forks residents to understand that crime in

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Grand Forks is on the low end, and the residents should not be afraid or concerned about living in Grand Forks. On a question from Council he stated there is nothing to show that we have repeat offenders. Discussion on the problem with youth drinking at the skateboard park. Sgt. Olsen stated that the problem is a police problem and they need to make sure that resources are targeted to be at the skateboard park more often. Acting Mayor Smith thanked Staff Sgt. Olsen for his presentation.

Boundary Communities Read/Columbia Basin Alliance for Literacy

Christy Luke adult literacy coordinator, made a presentation to Council on the Boundary Communities Read/Columbia Basin Alliance for Literacy project. She advised that the Columbia basin alliance for literacy goes from Grand Forks to Valemont to the Alberta border and west to Rock Creek, encompassing 17 communities. To promote literacy and life long learning throughout the Columbia basin.

She referred to a brochure previously circulated to Council which invited all members of Council and others to an event called Literacy Now. She advised that the planning session is intended to develop a plan of what we would like see in Grand Forks area. She concluded by expressing the fact that this is not intended to be a public event, and to further raise the issue of literacy and to invite council members to attend the session on November 3. Acting Mayor Smith thanked Ms. Luke for taking the time to come and make this presentation to Council.
