REGISTERED PETITIONS AND DELEGATIONS:

a) Boundary Weed Management Committee – Hoary Alyssum

Mayor Krog welcomed Barb Stewart to the meeting. By way of a power point presentation, Ms. Stewart outlined the objectives of the Boundary Weed Management Committee, and requested that the City work towards controlling noxious weeds on municipal properties within the municipal boundary. Ms. Stewart discussed the serious problem of hoary alyssum because it is toxic to horses and the weed has impacted the sale of hay in the Grand Forks valley. It is currently impacting adjacent agricultural lands. Controlling the weed will bring the City into compliance with the noxious weed act. Communities in Bloom will benefit as they will get marks if the

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community has a noxious weed control program. Weed committee has increased education efforts for residents of the valley. Offered to work with City Staff in developing a weed management plan for the City. Suggesting that the vacant city properties be mowed 3 times per year. Circulated information packages to all Members of Council.

RESOLVED THAT THE MATTER OF HOARY ALYSSUM BE REFERRED TO STAFF FOR A FOLLOW-UP REPORT ON THE OPTIONS FOR A PLAN TO CONTROL THE WEED ON CITY LANDS.

- 3. Presentations: You must limit your questions and or comments to a maximum of five (5) minutes including questions from Council. This will permit time for all that are present to participate.
- 4. Council may not make any decisions at this meeting and if Council wishes, the item would be referred to Staff for follow-up and recommendation for Council to consider at a regular meeting of Council.

<u>Alan Waite – 210 Winnipeg Avenue: -</u> Hoary Allysum

Discussed his problem regarding Horary Allysum and the infestation of the weed located on city property adjacent to his property.

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Connie Herman – Resident of Area D. – Hoary Allysum

Advised that she is currently working on crown land, controlling noxious weeds. She suggested that the City needs to make an effort to control the weed, in order for the noxious weed control program for lands outside the municipal boundary to be effective.
