<u>Michelle Caskey</u> as chair of Community Engagement Sub-committee of the Boundary Air Quality Committee stated her intent to lend support for the Anti-Idling Bylaw. She advised that the Committee's only recommendation is that the threshold for exemption from the bylaw be established at 30 degrees Celsius as opposed to 20 degrees Celsius.

<u>Joy Davies</u>, Coordinator of the BAQC, stated her support for the Anti-Idling bylaw, stating that each person needs to take responsibility for their emissions contribution to our airshed, and congratulated Council on having the courage in proceeding with the bylaw.

<u>Ingo Frankfurt</u>, as Public Health Inspector on behalf of the Interior Health Authority stated IHA support for the Anti-Idling bylaw, stating the strength will be in the educational part of the bylaw.
