He inquired if there was a future plan to develop 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> Streets between 72<sup>nd</sup> and 73<sup>rd</sup> Avenue. Michelle Caskey stated her concerns on the closure of the cowpath road and requested that Council reconsider this proposal.
