a) City Clerk's Report – Presentation by the Society for the Preservation of Community Arts and Culture

John Thomas on behalf of the Society for the Preservation of Community Arts and Culture made a presentation to Council outlining the activities of the Society during their first six months of operation. Mr. Thomas suggested that the SPCAC plan a soft start to opening of the museum displays, however they expect that the facility will be one of the best in the province. He advised that cataloguing will be complete by the end of October. He stated that there is more display space in new facility than in the former Boundary Museum building. For Council's information Mr. Thomas read a letter that the Society has written to the Boundary Museum Society in regards to sharing artifacts for the Fructova School displays. On a question from Council, Mr. Thomas confirmed that the entire museum area in the renovated historic courthouse will be accessible to the public, and further stated that professional consultants have been hired and will determine what the soft start opening will look like. He stated that the final report of the consultant is expected within a week's time. A discussion ensued as to "Past Perfect" software which is the standard software program used by museums across North America, and which has been purchased and is being used for cataloguing at this time. Mr. Thomas, along with Christy Luke, provided information on the cataloguing process currently underway.
