

1. On August 24<sup>th</sup>, I attended a meeting of the Phoenix Foundation to review a draft of the Vital Signs report that will be presented to the public on October 6<sup>th</sup>. Further information regarding this presentation will be forthcoming from the Phoenix Foundation.

The committee did request that a link or contact for affordable housing be made available on the City's website.

2. The Boundary Museum Board of Directors held their meeting on August 25<sup>th</sup>. We will be meeting with the Board of Directors of the Grand Forks Art Gallery at Fructova on October 7<sup>th</sup>. We have asked Sue Adrian to attend as well.

Past Perfect software has an additional component that will link to the Museum website. Sue hopes to have 200 to 500 items posted on-line by year-end.

3. On August 31<sup>st</sup>, I attended the announcement made by MP Colin Mayes, on behalf of Minister Yellich that the City had been awarded \$933,333 under the RinC program for improvements to the trails network, and that the RDKB had been awarded funding under the same program for improvements to the Aquatic Centre roof.
