UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Chief Financial Officer's Presentation – 2011-2015 Five Year Financial Plan a)

The Chief Financial Officer presented the 2011-2015 Five Year Financial Plan and advised that this is the third presentation in the public process. The CFO advised that the Capital Focus for 2011 is planning and that studies for Asset Management on all operations will be paramount in the planning process. The CFO advised that studies for Asset Management costs will be approximately \$150,000 in 2011 and \$150,000 in 2012. The Chief Financial Officer's presentation further outlined the future infrastructure projects as identified in the Kerr Wood Leidal Report.

The CFO further advised that the proposed Five Year Plan would see service levels consistent with 2010; but also included Council's consideration of recouped funding in the amount of \$30,000 should the City decide not to accept Credit Cards for Utility and Tax payment transactions commencing in 2011 and further to consider the proposal not to offer Grants in Aid for 2012 and subsequent years.

Questions Posed at the Conclusion of the Chief Financial Officer's Presentation

SYLVIA TREPTOW - Inquired on Council's plan for City's garbage and recycling contract. She was advised that the City's residential garbage is going to be a part of the Regional District's tender and that information is expected to come in January, 2011.

Ms. Treptow inquired if the "Studies and Planning" portion of the Five Year Plan were part of the 36 million dollar borrowing process as proposed by Kerr Wood Leidal, and was advised that some of the studies are identified in the KWL Report but that the proposed borrowing process is intended for infrastructure. Ms. Treptow further asked if there is to be a referendum with regard to the borrowing authorization, if this is binding on future Councils, and was advised that because it would be a borrowing or loan authorization process, that it would be binding on future Councils.

Councillor Moslin inquired with regard to Parcel Taxes, and the roll they would be playing in the repayment of the proposed infrastructure loan, and was advised the Parcel Taxes would be playing a major role in repaying the debt and that every infrastructure project would have to stand alone when determining the parcel tax charges. Councillor Moslin made note of the large transfer from reserves and surplus and inquired as to what these amounts included, and was advised that the amounts included all of proposed studies and minor capital programs.

Councillor Robert inquired with regard to success rates measured from previous work plans and if Management was effective in developing the current plan; whereas, he was advised by the Director of Operations that the City refines the work plan every year. Councillor Robert asked how the City compares to other communities with regard to taxes and users fees and if they are going to steadily increase. He was advised that the City is compared to other communities, and that, yes, taxes and users fees will continue to increase.
